

Anthony Wayne Youth Lacrosse Code of Conduct

Philosophy

This code of conduct is established to communicate the standards for conduct and behavior for our youth lacrosse program, both on and off of the field. Sportsmanship, commitment, effort, and enjoyment of the game are the foundations of our program. We will not compete and grow effectively without this foundation. We are proud to adopt the Anthony Wayne name, and we will behave in a responsible and self-disciplined manner as a reflection of our schools and community at large. Individual conduct inconsistent with this Code is a negative reflection on our program and will not be tolerated.

Conduct

Players may be denied participation for all or part of the season for general misconduct and/or violations of the Anthony Wayne Youth Lacrosse Code of Conduct.

Reporting Procedures

An infraction must be observed and/or reported by a teacher, coach, official, tournament director, AWYLAX board member, school administrator, or law enforcement agency. The infraction may also be validated by the parents of the player or by a statement of admission by the player.

Violations

The following may constitute violation of the Code of Conduct:

- [Any conduct by a player that is in violation of the student's code of conduct at their respective school including suspension or expulsion from school.
- [Any conduct by a player which may be both of a serious nature, and a violation of state, local, or federal criminal, or juvenile law.
- [Consumption, possession, use, purchase, sale, concealment, or transmission of alcohol, any controlled substance, inhalant, paraphernalia, intoxicant, non-prescription drug, counterfeit drug or any illegal drug and tobacco products.
- [Fighting, vandalism, theft, hazing, taunting, or bullying.
- [Inappropriate (graphic, sexual, vulgar, racist) communication via social media outlets or other electronic communication.
- [Any intentional act by the player which may discredit or bring disrepute to the AWYLAX program.

Penalties

Penalties for code violations will be determined by the AWYLAX board. No program fees will be refunded.
